Dr. Heidi Manning has studied planetary atmospheres and has worked on the development of instrumentation (mass spectrometers to aid in these studies). Dr. Manning worked on the development and calibration of a mass spectrometer for a Space Shuttle experiment (REFLEX), the Cassini mission (INMS) and most recently the Mars Science Laboratory (SAM instrument). She earned her bachelor's degree in physics at Gustavus Adolphus College and has a doctorate in physics from the University of Minnesota. Dr. Heidi Manning is the dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.
